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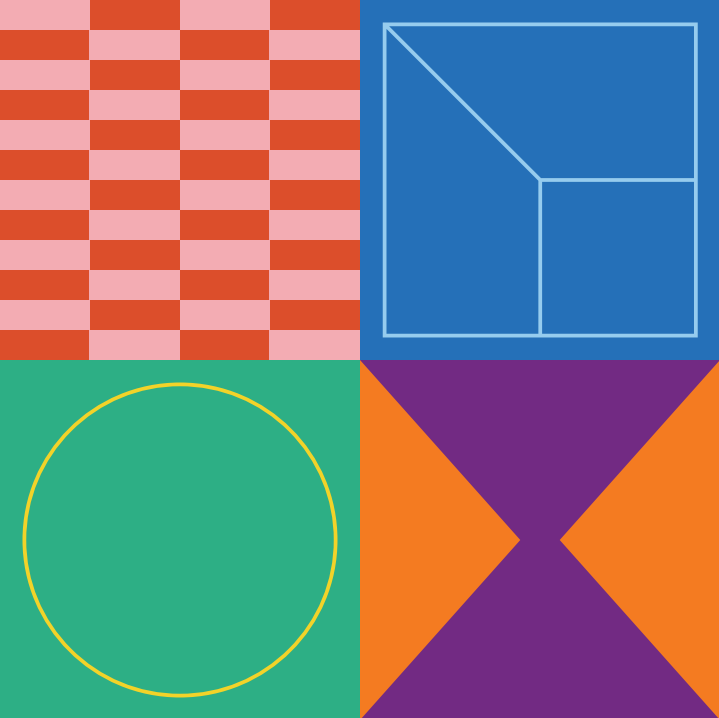
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# ART REFLECTION GUIDE





# ASK THE ART

When visiting ArtPrize and exploring contemporary art, visitors can ask themselves the following questions to initiate thoughtful conversations and reflections about the artworks:

## **What emotions does this artwork evoke in me?**

Reflect on the feelings and reactions the artwork elicits, and discuss these responses with others.

## **What do I notice first when looking at this artwork?**

Start by describing the visual elements that catch your eye, such as colors, shapes, or textures.

## **What do I think the artist is trying to convey through this artwork?**

Formulate your own interpretations and meaning behind the artwork based on your observations.

## **How does this artwork relate to my own experiences or beliefs?**

Consider personal connections to the artwork and share these associations with others.

## **What message or story might be hidden within the artwork?**

Engage in speculation about the narrative or themes the artist might have incorporated.

## **What techniques or materials did the artist use to create this artwork?**

Take note of the artistic methods employed and discuss their impact on the overall piece.

## **What do I find intriguing or unique about this artwork?**

Identify aspects that stand out to you and discuss your reasons for finding them interesting.

## **How does this artwork compare to others I've seen today?**

Compare and contrast different artworks you've encountered during your visit.

## **What questions do I have about this artwork or the artist's intentions?**

Generate questions about the artwork that you can later explore through research or discussions with others.

## **How does this artwork challenge or expand my understanding of contemporary art?**

Consider how the artwork pushes boundaries or introduces you to new perspectives in contemporary art.

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
